Are you interested in gaining experience in a clinical research or lab setting? We have three different types of unpaid internships available: psychological, biological or clinical research.

With all three internships, you will:

- Contribute to the understanding of Alzheimer's and neurodegenerative/ neurologic diseases
- Be a team member on Neuroscience research projects
- Receive free parking/daily cafe vouchers
- Work 30-40 hours/10-12 weeks (flexible start/end)

As a biological or clinical research intern, you will:

- Help with research projects
- Learn lab techniques (biological only)
- Review scientific literature
- Conduct chart reviews (clinical only)
- Complete a final report
- Have the opportunity to be a co-author on a scientific paper submitted for publication

As a psychology intern, you will:

- Have the opportunity to proctor and score various neuropsychological tests
- Collect and enter data
- Schedule and coordinate participant visits
- Interact with a variety of patient populations
